



B&L Dairy Show Rules

1. The show will be run following the HUK Rules & Regulations for Showing Dairy Cattle (in the HUK members handbook Point 14) – if you do not have a copy, I will be happy to forward them to you.
2. The B&L Committee requires all cattle brought on to the show field to have been Pre-Movement TB Tested. All exhibitors must bring a copy of their Pre-Movement testing certificate which the show will retain.
3. Passports & Pre-Movement testing certificates must be kept at hand to show to cattle stewards when entering the cattle area. They must then be taken to the passport office before judging commences.
4. Exhibitors must be aware of and adhere to ALL DEFRA regulations around the show day; for animals; health schemes; bio security etc
5. All animals to be halter trained
6. All stock to be led and in the hands of a competent person
7. Certificates / Movement permits / Passports should be available in all appropriate cases
8. All exhibitors must follow any instructions given by Border & Lakeland stewards and officials without argument
9. The B&L Show committee reserve the right to disqualify any animal exhibited in breach of the rules.
10. Any protest against an entry shall be in writing accompanied by a deposit of £50, to be handed to the Secretary. Any such protest will be investigated by two stewards and a Vet and the owner required to prove the correctness of the entry or forfeit the prize money. In the event of the protest being unsustainable the deposit shall be forfeited to the funds of the Club.
11. The judge's decision is final. Any dispute must be brought to the Secretary's attention, without disrupting any current / subsequent classes.
12. At all times exhibitors and their entourage must conduct themselves in a manner appropriate to a family show.
13. In the interests of the public and for safety reasons the committee reserve the right to (i) cancel the show and or (ii) to refuse vehicles onto the show field.
14. The Club will not be liable in respect of any claim for loss, injury or damage which any stock, article or person may sustain from accident or otherwise at / or in connection with the show, except in the case of proven negligence on behalf of the Club.
15. All livestock exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover.

16. The Committee using their discretion may refuse or remove any competitor or member of the public from the show field.
17. The show will be run in accordance with current COVID-19 Rules and Regulations as set out by the Government at the time of the event.
18. Members of the Press and Photographers engaged by the Committee will be taking pictures around the show field taking shots of Exhibits and Exhibitors as well as Members of the Public. By entering the Show your photograph may be taken and used as part of promotional materials as well as on our website and social media.
19. By making an entry to the show exhibitors accept that they must agree to these General Rules and Conditions
20. Entries close 12th July 2021 entries accepted via post, email or phone.
21. Class fee £5 per class Young Handler classes are free.
